THE INSTRUCTOR MUST CHECK THE CLIENT PRIOR TO DISMISSAL AT ALL APPOINTMENTS

RETURN FOR CARE APPOINTMENTS

AFTER INITIAL ASSESSMENTS HAVE BEEN COMPLETED, A CLIENT ASSESSMENT UPDATE MUST BE PERFORMED AT THE START OF EACH SUBSEQUENT APPOINTMENT.

- a. Health History update. Changes to medical history or EIOE should be noted on the Treatment Record. Vital signs, blood sugar levels, and pre-medication should also be documented on the Treatment Record.
- b. Cursory oral inspection to note any changes in EIOE. Report all findings to the instructor.
Instructor's cursory oral inspection
- c. Assessment of area(s) scaled at previous appointments for gingival status and residual calculus, and necrotic cementum. SRP (scaling and root planing should be completed if indicated) before continuing treatment on another quadrant.

INSTRUCTOR CHECK-IN

- a. Present the day's treatment plan to client
- b. PFI followed by Disease Control Instruction (DCI)
- c. Begin the day's treatment

Clients must receive a faculty check before dismissal at every appointment.
